- Completion of a habilitation project in one of the central research areas of the chair
- Independent research in the field of Anglophone Literatures and Cultures
- Teaching workload: 5 SWS
- Administrative tasks and support with ongoing research projects
- Interest in science communication and public outreach
- Collaboration with academic centres and networks at JMU, such as the "Kolleg für Mittelalter und Frühe Neuzeit" or "Arbeitskreis Digitale Editionen"

Qualifications:

- University degree (MA, state examination or equivalent) in the field of English Literature and Cultural Studies with an excellent final grade
- Very good doctorate in the field of Anglophone literature and/or cultural studies
- Excellent skills in the English language and sufficient skills in the German language
- Specialization in one of the following areas is desirable: early modern period; Shakespeare; contemporary literature; Gender Studies; Al and Literature; Scottish, Irish or Canadian Studies
- Experience in academic publishing (also in English) as well as with third-party funding applications is desirable
- Knowledge in the field of Digital Humanities and/or AI is desirable
